


Access to Clinton Keith Road will be restricted with the exception of signalized intersections.

- Goats completed their task in March 2016.


Contractor Information

- Sukut Construction Santa Ana, CA

- Work hours 7 am 6 pm M–F
 - No weekend work anticipated at this time

Access During Construction

- Access will be provided for residents via Greenberg Place, Arendt Lane, Avenida Manana
- Roads will be graded at Arendt Lane and Greenberg Place to provide access to Whitewood Road (signalized intersection)
- Local residents will have access to Los Alamos via Menifee Road

Access During Construction



Blast Excavation

- A portion of the job may require the contractor to perform blast excavation
- Similar process was used on SR-79 in the Winchester area
- Emergency responders will be positioned during blast operations to reduce response time
- Notices will be distributed to the school and residents prior to each blast event

Outreach Campaign

- Stakeholders / First Responders, School District Transportation and local transit were briefed prior to the utility relocation work
- Public meetings were held prior to the start of construction
- Regular meetings / briefings will be held as necessary to keep all apprised of project milestones
- Ongoing coordination will take place between the City of Murrieta, the County of Riverside, School District Management, and Emergency Services
