This structure is a stuccoed flat-roofed early Spanish-style house. The Mediterranean Revival style is evident in the broken parapet which leads to an arched entrance to the back yard. Tile rims the parapet and small tile shed roofs are located over the two sets of matching windows in the front facade. A covered porch has an arched entrance with wall curving gracefully down to form a 30-inch stucco front patio wall. Windows indicate an early 1920s construction.

Staff Recommendation:


