Your application for interconnection under SDG&E's Net Energy Metering (NEM) program has been received by San Diego Gas & Electric's (SDG&E) NEM Interconnection Team.

As soon as SDG&E determines that your request is complete and any required fees have been paid, the next step in the interconnection process is for your City/County to complete an electrical inspection. After SDG&E receives notification from your City/County that your system has passed inspection and no outstanding issues exist with your project, you'll receive an e-mail from us providing you with SDG&E's permission to operate (PTO) your Backup Generators system in parallel with our electric grid.

## \*\*\*\*\*Important Information About Electricity Pricing Plans\*\*\*\*\*

Effective April 1, 2018, all new NEM customers are required to be billed under a Time of Use (TOU) pricing plan. TOU separates the hours of a day into different time periods, on-peak, off-peak and super off-peak. TOU plans give you two ways to save by shifting your electricity use to lower cost hours of the day or by reducing your overall usage. If you receive PTO from SDG&E after March 31, 2018, the pricing plan on your account will automatically switch to Schedule TOU-DR1 at the same time your account begins billing under net energy metering (unless you're already enrolled in a TOU plan).

## \*\*\*\*\*Important Information About SDG&E Access Requirements\*\*\*\*\*

According to SDG&E's California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC)-approved Electric Rule 16, Section 11, SDG&E must have the right to enter and leave your premises at any time for any purposeconnected with furnishing electric service. As applicable, these rights include, but are not limited to:

- a. The use of a utility-approved locking device, if Applicant desires to prevent unauthorized access to utility's facilities;
- b. Safe and ready access for utility personnel, free from unrestrained animals;
- c. Unobstructed ready access for utility's vehicles and equipment to install, remove, repair or maintain its facilities; and,
- d. Removal of any and all of its property installed on Applicant's Premises after the termination of service.
